Application for Evaluation by North American Banding Council at Trainer level

Before applying for evaluation you must already be certified at the Bander Level. You should be aware of the Expectations for Trainers of the North American Banding Council, and very familiar with the material in the NABC manuals and the first 40 pages of Pyle (1997). You also need to have relevant practical experience in teaching new banders. It is preferable that you have sought out opportunities to learn by working with other experienced banders or seeking educational experiences at one of the Regional Banding Association meetings or taking Banding courses.

Once accepted for an evaluation session you will need to complete the written exam in advance of the evaluation session described below UNLESS you have already achieved a grade of 90% or better on the written exam in the past 5 years. Any certified trainer (even one who has trained you) may administer the closed book written examination. A list of certified trainers is available on our web site (http://www.nabanding.net/list-of-trainers lists trainers alphabetically. It is your responsibility to find a certified trainer to proctor your exam. You may not take the evaluation session without first passing the written exam. If you cannot arrange to take the written exam prior to arriving at the evaluation session then you will need to make arrangements with the session organizer to take it at the beginning of the evaluation session.

During the evaluation session two or more certified NABC trainers, who have not participated significantly in your training, will evaluate you and provide you with a report card summarizing the results of the evaluation. Their decision will be final. If you pass you will receive a certificate. Certification as a Trainer entitles you to evaluate others. We hope that it will also increase your opportunities for passing on knowledge, skill and a high standard of ethics to other banders.
